

Genital Plastic Surgery Is Increasingly Popular

Gynecologists across the United States agree that a rising number of females are stressing about below-the-belt beauty. "Women are concerned with the appearance of their vaginas and labia since there is little or no hair to conceal the area," says Mary Jane Minkin, a New Haven, Connecticut, ob-gyn. "They're agonizing over body parts that they probably never gave a second thought to before the Brazilian wax took off."

That angst seems to be triggering a surge in genital plastic surgery. "Nearly all of my labiaplasty patients remove their pubic hair," reports David Matlock, gynecologic surgeon in Los Angeles. Dr. Matlock teaches MDs how to do the procedure and says his training courses are selling out. More proof of this troubling trend: According to the American Society of Plastic Surgeons, 1,030 vaginal rejuvenation surgeries (which includes aesthetic labia tightening) were performed by member surgeons in 2006, a 30 percent increase from the year before.

Staying Fresh Down South Is a Bit Simpler

Nixing hair won't eliminate your vaginal odor, but it may improve your scent. "There are sweat glands in the pubic region, and since the area is covered by hair and clothing, moisture gets locked in," says Dr. Thompson. Hair traps perspiration and traces of discharge and urine. If you're bald below, fluids are more easily wiped off or absorbed into your underwear instead of lingering on your skin.

An Itchy STD Now May Be Close to Extinction


And here's some pretty amazing news:
